NPTI has been serving the community for more than 50 years. In order to prepare engineers for the many new thermal power plants being built across the country at the time, the Central Water and Power Commission (Power Wing) opened Thermal Power Station Personnel Training Institutes in Naveli (1965), Durgapur (1968), Bardarpur, Delhi (1974), and Nagpur (1975). In Bangalore, it also founded the Power Systems Training Institute (PSTI) in 1972 and the Hot line Training Centre (HLTC) in 1974. The 'Rajya Deeksha Committee' established by the Government of India in the 1970s to improve the power sector of the country recommended formal training for the
